Intertribal Agriculture Council Annual Conference, Las Vegas

As part of ROC's support of the **Growing GRASS** regenerative ranching work, Michael joined teammates Jim Kleinschmit and Terrius Harris at the Intertribal Agriculture Council annual conference in Las Vegas last week. The goal: to recruit Indigenous beef and bison producers for the GRASS project so they can sell hides and other byproducts to high value fashion, pharmaceutical and pet food brands seeking to show their commitments to solving climate and other environmental challenges. 1,200 attendees gained knowledge from 51 panel presentation covering a variety of topics including regenerative practices, business development, communications and policy work. Indigenous producers have always worked with nature to ensure health, resilience and viability for as far into the future as we can imagine. The event highlighted the advances made in the last four years with major onetime investments from federal sources that will be



transformative. The event provided many contacts with bison and beef producers, processing facilities and birthed relationship with new allies. Michael reconnected with Indigenous rancher **Kelsey Ducheneaux Scott**, featured in the film**Common Ground** and in a **Flipping the Table podcast**.
